Dear Parent/Carer

At the George Eliot Academy we have an aspirational, knowledge rich, five-year curriculum. To support our pupils with this, the information is also available on our website. We provide details of the curriculum on our school website. We send a termly letter home with details of what pupils will be studying in each subject, each term.

Pupils in Year 10 will sit their mid-year formal assessments during the week of 15<sup>th</sup> - 19<sup>th</sup> January 2024 and their end of year assessments will be during the week of 13<sup>th</sup> - 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

Pupils in Years 7-9 will sit their mid-year formal assessments during the week of 22<sup>nd</sup> - 26<sup>th</sup> January 2024 and their end of year assessments will be during the week of 13<sup>th</sup> - 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

These assessments will assess work that they have covered throughout the whole school year. Year 7-9 pupils will sit some of these assessments in their class environment and some in the examination hall. This supports pupils to familiarise themselves with the demands and expectations of formal examination procedures. Year 10 pupils will receive a timetable and will complete their examinations in examination conditions as they would in Year 11 GCSEs. Pupils will have a period of revision and additional supporting materials will be made available to them.
